



How to View Our Online Concert

This virtual concert experience is broken up into six parts. You will be able access them online starting **November 5, 2020**, until **January 8th, 2021**. Here are some tips to help you and your students interact with this video series!

To begin the concert, start with Part I on the main video player. Be sure to pause each video when you are done watching!



Once you are finished watching Part I, scroll down and click to watch Part II on the video menu. You may also toggle between Parts I–VI as needed by clicking on the thumbnail of your choice or by clicking one of the six dots below the video menu.

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Which videos should I watch?

We suggest watching the videos in the order they appear—Parts I–VI; but when deciding which parts might be most relevant to your students, the below descriptions may help your planning:

- Parts I, III, and IV have special invitations for the virtual audience—of any age—to participate with the actors and musicians in this concert. These moments are meant to illuminate the special qualities of Florence Price's compositions and support active listening.
- Parts II, V, and VI focus on milestones in Florence Price's life story that connect to important moments in United States History.

What's the best way to view these videos with my school community?

Option 1 (for Remote Learning)

- Send the Concert Link you received to your students.
- Assign your class to watch the virtual concert. This does not have to be done in one sitting and can be spread out over time. We would suggest having your students watch some videos on one day, and the rest on another!
- Gather (online or in person) with your students or school community after watching to discuss their experience. We'd love to know if your school is planning a virtual meetup after watching! Feel free to contact Manager of Community Programs, Evander Louis at Elouis@oslmusic.org.

Option 2 (for In-Person Learning)

- Plan a date or multiple class periods to watch the concert videos with your class or school community using the link you received for access. This does not have to be done in one sitting and can be spread out over time.
- We would suggest watching with your students on a projector or connecting to a large screen in an auditorium, if possible.

For **blended learning classrooms**, feel free to use a combination of Options 1 and 2 while engaging with your class.
